

## MISSION MOMENT Mark Smith, Elder

The Missions Committee would like to thank you for your donations of time, talents, money and prayers. As a result of your continued support, we continue support of our various global, national and local ministries doing a lot of God's work. Here is a summary of our accomplishments in 2019:

a God's Work

**Cents-ability:** Your contributions to the first of the month offerings and when the donation cans were placed on the tables during potlucks generated \$515. These monies are used to support food banks throughout the Presbytery.

**Pedal-4-Protein:** Ride coordinator, Patty Sanders presented a Moment for Mission in August requesting our support for the annual bicycle ride that generates funds for use by the area food banks (like Cents-

ability). You purchased \$851 of Patty's items that day, \$412 of which came back to FPCU for our local food bank.

**Care Packages:** We continued to collect, package and send peanut butter, beans and chewable vitamins to the Caritas Orphanage in Djibouti and cookies for our military troops stationed nearby.

**Uganda Orphanage:** As a result of our two Meals-to-Go Fundraisers and our rummage sale, we were able to raise a little over \$6,000 that were earmarked for this ministry. We also carried over about \$3500 from last year for a total of \$9500 to support our efforts. The money will be used to support the orphanage and send Kevin and Shelly Mack to the orphanage in January, 2020 and Pastor David in February, 2020. In the past, our funds helped pay to construct the orphanage. This upcoming trip will be the second visit for Kevin and Shelly who, in addition to spending valuable time with the kids and Pastor John, will be focused on assessing how we can best support Pastor John and his work at the orphanage, going forward. This will be Pastor David's first trip. He will be spending time meeting with Pastor John and other local religious leaders and visiting the Embassy to assist Pastor John in securing a Visa to travel outside of Uganda.

**Operation Christmas Child:** In the past, our church was the collection center for this annual event in the Ukiah area. This year, a new location was established. Our members continue to support filling shoeboxes with gifts for the children.

**Sweat Equity Mission:** This year we embarked on this new endeavor. Volunteers spent time working with local young couples who are constructing new homes with their own labor. Next year, we plan to travel to Lake County to assist the Hope Crisis Resource Network in their efforts rebuilding damaged or lost homes from the fires that have devastated the area since 2015.

**Other Support:** Separate from the monies raised for the various activities listed above, we also raised \$4350 to support various other local faith-based individuals and organizations. These include: Peggy Arendt (Reach Global), Nor Cal Christian Ministries, One Great Hour of Sharing, Target Truth Ministries, Student Ministries, The Alkare Foundation, Presbyterian Church (USA) and Interfaith Lunches.

And lastly, we are **DISCONTINUING THE "SHOE-RECYCLING" MINISTRY** The effort, while in some ways is worthwhile, was a very labor-intensive project with very little return. We are continuing the "Shoes-for-You" ministry, but we are no longer collecting shoes for recycling. **Please, do not drop off any more shoes or any other rummage.**

# Give

## New Ways of Giving via the FPCU Website

FPCU now offers members and friends two new options for giving. Mobile giving is now available with either the Tithe.ly and/or Givelify app, giving platforms for churches. With Mobile Giving you can download the Tithe.ly or Givelify mobile app to your smartphone or tablet and give to FPCU anytime, anywhere.

On Sunday morning during worship service members and friends in the FPCU congregation traditionally give an offering to God as thanks for the blessings that God gives to us. Worshipers place their gifts of cash and checks in one of the offering plates as it is passed by the ushers.


FPCU's new giving options through the Tithe.ly or Givelify platform give members and friends the ability to give their offering anytime and from any place they may be – even during the worship offering time.

Giving to FPCU is no longer confined to the hour that we're in church. If we stay home because we don't feel well, are on vacation, or have other plans, we don't have to miss giving our offering. If a friend or relative of a member lives out of the area or even in another country, they can easily contribute to FPCU using their smartphone.

With Mobile Giving you can give to FPCU by using either the Tithe.ly or Givelify app on your smartphone or tablet.

- Go to your smartphone's app store and search for the Tithe.ly or Givelify app. (For an iPhone or iPad go to the Apple App Store; For Android device go to Google Play). Once you have downloaded the Tithe.ly or Givelify app, you will need to register online to give to FPCU. The apps are free to download and free to use. There is a low 2.9% + \$0.30 fee per transaction. For example, a \$100 donation would be a net \$96.80 sent to FPCU.
- Once you've downloaded the Tithe.ly/Givelify app search for First Presbyterian Church, Ukiah. Follow the prompts to Create an Account and Give. It's that simple!

- Youth Group: Continuing to combine 6th-12th graders on weekly basis, but splitting boys/girls for small group time. We are reading through the book of John using the Serendipity Bible. We are considering extending youth group by a half hour (6 to 8 pm instead of 6 to 7:30 pm).
- **Sunday Morning Activities:** Volunteer adult leaders are set for the rest of the year. There is a concern regarding the low attendance for Sunday morning Sunday school.
- **Hangout:** A Hangout Parent Night is scheduled for 12-19-19; Christmas Caroling will be included (may have to reschedule due to conflict with Session meeting on same date).
- Movie Night 10-18-19: A movie night party for high schoolers. Activities included playing games, celebrating Halloween, and watching Scooby-doo.
- **Trunk or Treat 10-31-19:** The event included 10 cars for Trunk or Treating, a craft station, corn hole, and music. There was, however, no chili due to the power outage. We passed out a lot of Hangout fliers.
- Fall Retreat 11-1-19 to 11-3-19: Retreat had to be postponed because of the fires. Plans are underway to reschedule, probably in January, 2020.
- Youth Group Christmas Party, TBD: Will be held at Roe and Kitty's again this year.
- Young Adult Group: Meeting time has be changed to every other Friday, 7pm to 9pm at the church.. We hope to hire 1-2 youth to babysit on those nights (\$15-\$20 each) in the nursery.

#### **Resource Council Reports:**

- Finance: The Session was presented with three reports. 1)Income Statement for General Funds. Income was less than budgeted (\$18,885-\$17,701), while expenses exceeded budget (\$20,377-\$20,857). Manse maintenance and repairs exceeded budgetary plans. FPCU continues to be on track to have a shortfall for 2019 to income of \$9,137, which is a significant improvement from the budgeted shortfall of \$31,467. 2)Designated Income and Expenses. By 9-30-19 an additional \$22,614 had come into the account from Missions, Pass Through, Per Capita, and General Memorial. At the same time, \$14,005 of the funds have been spent on various projects. The Designated Funds Balance is \$49,263. 3)PresBeat Summary. Through October 2019 FPCU YTD income (\$212,858) lags behind expenses (\$218,714), leaving the church with a current shortfall of \$5,856. The current checking account balance is \$137,770, and the savings account balance is \$143,595. The designated fund balance is \$49,262. There continues to be interest shown in the Ramos property.
- Buildings and Grounds: The next meeting is 12-5-19. The next workday and Christmas party is 12-7-19.
- **Personnel:** Still looking for a Children's Ministry Assistant. The evaluation for Alexis has been completed. David's will be completed when he returns.
- **Nominating:** The committee has made progress however, we still have some contacts to make. We will be ready Sunday.

#### **Family Council Reports:**

- Worship-Music: Hanging of the Greens and dedication of the shoeboxes will be this Sunday, 11-24-19. 12-1-19 is the first Sunday of Advent.
- Christian Education: We are attempting to recruit additional Sunday School Teachers for the purpose of building depth to the Sunday School Volunteer Program.
- **Congregational Life:** Reminder that Session will set up for the Harvest dinner, 12-15-19.
- **Communication:** The new church website should be ready by the first of the new year.

**OLD BUSINESS:** The Jr. High room has been transformed into a quiet room/meditation room. Lately it has been used as a storage room. An improved communication system is going to be setup/implemented so the room can maintain character/purpose while recognizing the need to be somewhat flexible.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Clerk will talk to David regarding scheduling dates for instruction, examination, ordination, and installation of incoming Elders and Deacons. These events hopefully occur before the scheduled 1-16-20 Session meeting and possible January deployment/Africa trip.
